Whitby's arts and culture gems include:

- Heritage Downtowns in Whitby and Brooklin are areas of historic importance to the community and include significant residential, commercial and institutional heritage properties.
- Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee (LACAC)
 Heritage Whitby Assists the Town Council in the conservation
 and preservation of heritage buildings, properties and resources.
- Whitby Courthouse Theatre Housed in a 150 year old court room within the Centennial Building, the 160-seat theatre was completely renovated in 2003. Web: www.whitbytheatre.org
- Station Gallery Originally a train station, the gallery features exhibitions by local artists, touring exhibitions, and art programs. Web: www.whitbystationgallery.com
- Historical Walking Tours are organized by the Whitby Public Library with assistance from LACAC Heritage Whitby.
- Whitby Historical Museum Houses a unique collection of artifacts of early life in Southern Ontario.
- **Film Whitby** Offers an abundance of filming locations including heritage sites, thoroughly modern locales and picturesque landscapes.
- **Brooklin Horticultural Society** A voluntary organization founded in 1921 for residents who enjoy creating attractive gardens.

- Farmers' Market Operates outdoors from May to October in Downtown Whitby. Here you will find local fruits, vegetables, hand-crafted items, plants and flowers.
- Trafalgar Castle School An independent residential and day school for girls grades 5 through 12. Constructed between 1859 and 1862 as a private residence, it is now home to girls from all over the world. Enrollment is kept to a maximum of 240 students.

- Whitby Public Library Built in 2005, the award winning 54,000 square foot Central Library is anchored by a civic square with a reflecting pool. The facility offers wireless internet access, fireplace-equipped lounges, and a café.

- Brooklin Community Centre and Library This 40,000 square foot building includes a new library, senior's activity centre, a youth centre, pre-school program space, gymnasium, a large multi-purpose room and a number of smaller meeting and craft rooms.
- Durham College Food Centre With a focus on culinary arts, the centre includes hydroponic gardens, a food processing centre, agriculture and science laboratories.
- Whitby Seniors' Centres provide instructional classes, leisure programs and support services.
